December



Branch Updates...

To help guide Branch Leaders and committees to run their meetings a Branch Handbook is available. If you do not have one in your Branch, you can download it from the Mothers' Union Peterborough website, search on the Administration page, or contact the Diocesan Secretary, Jean Rose, and she will send you one.

This booklet gives guidance on the roles of officers in your branch but also advises what meetings you may like to hold with your members.

It is helpful to arrange a branch programme which features meetings linked to the annual theme for the year, currently 'Transformation Now'. Meetings should be fun and based on the purposes, aims, values and objectives of the Mothers' Union and help to forward its work.

The list of Mothers' Union speakers is being revised and will be issued to all branches when it is ready. Do note that our Mothers' Union speakers do not charge the branch any money for their travelling nor is any fee payable. Travel expenses are paid for by the diocese, and the speaker claims these back from the Diocesan Treasurer. The handbook advises that every meeting of the Branch should include an act of worship and a time of prayer. This is a great opportunity to pray for local MU projects, AFIA, Lunch Club and our linked branches.

Your meeting may be the time to decide on a local project that you can carry out within your church or helping your church with some outreach event. It is also expected that branches will raise funds in support of the objects of Mothers' Union, locally, nationally and throughout the world. Money raised by Mothers' Union members may only be used to support Mothers' Union projects and activities. It cannot be used to give donations to other local charities, even if these are visiting your branch as guest speakers. If members want to give funds to another charity, they will have to take up a personal collection amongst themselves and it should not be entered into the accounts as it is not supported by Mothers' Union. This is a ruling from the Charity Commission so we have to abide by it.

Ideas for meetings on the theme of Transformation Now can be found on the main Mothers' Union website, do have a look, and above all enjoy meeting together, praying together and having fun together.

During the service at Westminster Abbey on May 6th, Charles will pledge his life to serve his people and country, and he will be rewarded with a crown and sceptre and gain a throne.



Below are some photographs of poppy displays – they are stunning!








A group of us met in

Spotlight on Daventry Deanery



Daventry Holy Cross

Daventry branch has very good support from their Priest Rev. Dawn Stokes, who is a member of the MU. In the last eighteen months, 7 new members have joined the branch. The branch's involvement with its church, provides 100 mini-Easter Eggs for the congregation, 100 posies are made for Mothering Sunday and it supports Daventry Area Community Transport (DACT) for Holy Cross. The branch has a full programme, trying to have a quiet afternoon each year and an outing. Last year they went to Earls Barton to look at the church and have lunch at Jeyes Coffee Shop.

Harpole All Saints

Harpole branch has 13 members, most are elderly which causes difficulties. The branch is run entirely, by Hazel and Roger Fountain who are both members and whose work is vital. For 30 years the branch has been organising a knitted Travelling Nativity. Last year was its first outing after covid and it was a great success, 83, children and parents were at the crib service on Christmas Eve. Hazel has also started a "Mums and Tots" group, which is well attended with 15 parents registered. The year started with a very successful New Year's Party with a visiting pianist and lots of rousing singing. They also had a visit to Duston Retirement Village with a simple service in their chapel. Forthcoming events include the regular summer lunch, fund raising for the church at the Summer Fete and serving teas at Harpole Scarecrow Festival to raise money for MU charities.

Weedon Bec. St. Peter & St. Paul

Weedon is the smallest of the three branches in the Daventry Deanery and is very successfully run by committee. It is still very active having a full programme of meetings, outings, services and an annual cream tea in August. Although the majority of members are elderly, they still like to attend the annual Deanery Advent Carol Service, held by tradition at Newnham. I think Weedon is an example to other branches, don't give up if you can't get officers, you can come together and run a very successful branch by committee.
